Nacre debuts with program that spans 100 years dance history

ALBANY — Every history lesson should be like Saturday's delightful debut performance of Nacre, the Capitol Region's new historical dance company. Founding director Beth Hartle Fecteau has created a beautifully balanced program that travels through 100 years of dance, with expert tour guides to escort us on the journey.

The company is made up of local dance students, most still in high school, and professional performers, but the casting and the selection of repertory skillfully sidesteps any uncomfortable disparity between levels of talent or experience. Nacre showed impressive versatility in works ranging from Isadora Duncan's 1910 "Bacchanal" from "Iphigenie en Aulis" to a brand-new piece choreographed on the company by visiting artist Vanessa Paige Swanson.

In keeping with Fecteau's mission to educate the public — and her dancers — about the legacy of 20th-century modern dance, each piece was introduced by someone with a direct connection to it, adding context and a deeper understanding to the audience's direct experience of the work. Charles Humphrey Woodford and Mino Nicolas traced the lines connecting Woodford's mother, the choreographer Doris Humphrey, to Martha Graham, Ruth St. Denis, Charles Weidman and Ted Shawn (whose work was also represented). From Judith Fiore, who studied with Donald McKayle, we learned about the New Dance Group, a pioneering midcentury choreographers' collective of which McKayle was a member.

Watching the dances themselves after these introductions was akin to seeing a painting in a museum after reading about it in an

art history book. In Humphrey's "Air for the G String," (with the Willow String Quartet playing Johann Sebastian Bach's composition) the five dancers, in gauzy pastel dresses and flowing drapery, moved with regal slowness, like Greek statuary come to life. As a court dancer set on enchanting the Shah of Iran, Debra Rutledge swirled and twirled through Shawn's 1916 solo "Bailerina Real."

Duncan's "Bacchanal," introduced by Jeanne Bresciani, a protégée of Duncan's adopted daughter Maria Theresa, was a charming embodiment of the freedom and vibrancy that Bresciani described as Duncan's legacy.

Costumed as colorful fairies, the 10 dancers pranced and sprang like bouncing lambs to the music of Christoph Willibald Gluck.

The company also showed four etudes from the collection of the American Dance Legacy Institute, each combining excerpts from the work of a single choreographer. "Rooms Etude," from Anna Sokolow's 1955 "Rooms," is a spare, elegant piece in which each of the seven dancers is isolated in her own space, defined by a folding chair which she moves on and around. Work from McKayle (with live drumming and song by Garland Nelson), the jazz-dance choreographer Danny Buraczeski and David Parsons highlighted (respectively) forcefulness, playfulness and whimsicality.

With the lush, lyrical "Still/Flowing," Swanson picked up many of the threads that had come before and twisted them into her own gorgeously composed design, bringing the lineage of modern dance into the year 2009.
